
### RUMMAGE SALE

#### SENIOR PROFILE: Ronald Levine Leister



Ronnie was born February 14, 1938 in Hanover General Hospital, Hanover, Pennsylvania, the son of George A. and Jennie Rill Leister. When his parents brought him home to the family farm on Leister's Church Road, he was welcomed by his two sisters, Lavena and Betty. IN the early 1950's, the family welcomed a foster child, Larry D. Ward, a.k.a. "L.D.". Ronnie had many chores and on-the-job training, so it was obvious he was meant to be a farmer from day one.

He speaks fondly of his childhood involvement with St. John's – attending the picnics, getting his quarter to spend on a soda and a hot dog and going through confirmation classes with Reverend Willis R. Brenneman (who was very strict).

Ronnie graduated from Westminster Senior High School in 1956. That same year, Mr. J. Owings Rebert asked him if he would close graves for St. John's cemetery. Sometime in the early 1980's, he also began opening the graves as well. He served almost 50 years with these cemetery responsibilities. Thank you, Ronnie, for a job well done.

In 1961, while on a trip to Ocean City, he met Carolyn Rill. Apparently, things went well as they were married in 1962. They were blessed with three children – Sonya, Dr. R. Todd and Jason Leister. Eventually, four grandchildren came along – Jacob, Sarah, Austin and Ashley Leister.

Ronnie is the third generation on the family farm which produces various grains and vegetables. He and Carolyn work well together as a team. They both talked of how modern equipment and technology have made farming / agriculture business easier in many ways.

Many people know Ronnie better as "The Corn Man". He explained that this endeavor actually began as a hobby, with some corn and vegetables sold from the back of a wagon. People soon came from far and wide to purchase the famous and delicious Leister corn. The demand grew and they needed help from family members, especially the grandchildren in this booming "corn business". He and Carolyn both agree the experience was great and it taught the grandchildren responsibility, good work ethics and how to deal with other people.

Ronnie, thank you so much for your many contributions to our church family and to the community at large.



#### Policy on Unrestricted Gifts and Bequests

This document is meant to codify a set of practices to guide our use of exceptional gifts to St. John's. Many wills, trusts & bequests include language about the specific purpose(s) of the gift. This document refers to those gifts which do not include specific wishes and restrictions. These decisions and deliberations will be conducted by the Council and such other committees and/or individuals the Council designates. This does not rule out the creating of ad hoc committee(s).

#### 1. We will tithe 10% of the unrestricted gift.

As Christians, we recognize that everything we have is a gift from God. Tithing is an important spiritual discipline that reminds us to depend on God's grace rather than to follow our culture's call to depend on ourselves, or to seek security in accumulated wealth. Tithing is an opportunity for our congregation to participate in important and exciting work done by other non-profits.

As we consider where to tithe our money, we will use the following guidelines:

#### a. Preference of Lutheran-affiliated and other faith-based charities and Organizations

The gospel of Christ calls us to work for justice in this world. We believe that supporting organizations who also work from a place of faith, answering God's call to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with our God, is a way to show the world God's love. It is important for us to support the work of Lutheran-affiliated agencies. However, if a Lutheran agency is not meeting the needs we would like to support, we will turn to other faith-based organizations first, and secular agencies second.

b. Preference for local community charities and organizations (Carroll, Mid Maryland, Southern PA, Greater Baltimore)

St. John's supports a variety of local groups including Carroll Food Sunday, NESAP, New Life For Girls, and others. If the cliché "charity begins at home" has any place in our decisions and deliberations; this is it. We should continue to be mindful of other local groups, especially those that have a connection to our church and congregants.

#### c. Charities and organizations that put others first

While all charities support causes and needs of others, some use the money more effectively. Several agencies track this effective use of donations. Charity Watch is the premier site/organization for tracking this data.

#### 2. We will transfer 10% of the gift to Property or Building funds

Few people express "keeping the lights on" as the goal for a bequest or gift. However, good stewardship of our church, outbuildings and property is an important goal. Some importance must be given to improving, updating and maintaining the physical structures that comprises St. John's. This can include initiating and completing a specific project or joining with existing funds for a larger/more long-term expenditure.


#### 3. We will use 80% of the gift to strengthen the life and mission of the congregation.


The Council will actively seek ways to use unrestricted gifts to strengthen the life and mission of our congregation, which might even include increasing the percentage allocations under Sections 1 or 2 above. For example, unrestricted gifts could assist St. John's in growing our congregation and social media presence. Consistent with our constitution, Council will present to the congregation for approval any recommended distribution under this section, which meets or exceeds the existing constitutional threshold for such spending/distributions, currently set at \$6,000.

**Final Note**: At all points in this process Council should be acting prayerfully and thoughtfully. Considering the long-term benefits of these actions, the long-standing traditions and practices of the church, and, to the extent possible, the wishes of the donor(s).
