"Hi, it's Bikiltu Wakgari. I am now 16 years old. In the morning when I wake up, I wash my face, get dressed and eat my breakfast. I often eat bread with tea. I do my chores, which include making tea.

I'm in the 9th grade at school, which is near my home. In the afternoon, I usually read, study or play with friends. When I play, I enjoy jumping. I do my afternoon chores,

which include making lunch, and my favorite food is traditional / injera (a sourdough-risen flatbread) with sauce.

In the evening, I get ready for bed when I say my prayers.

Another thing I'd like you to know about me is that this year, God has blessed us with crop production! I would like to know, what is your favorite food?"
