### St. John's Missionary's Work

Friends of St. Johns,

I am excited to announce that I will be returning to El Salvador this fall to continue mission work with the communities there. I have been praying for an opportunity to return to El Salvador since my last trip two years ago and God has answered my prayers. I'm planning on leaving shortly after Labor Day and staying through the first couple of weeks in November.

The ministry organization I will be serving with, Christ for the City International (CFCI), recognizes the growing poverty in mega-cities, such as San Salvador, El Salvador, where the poor often live within deplorable means. Their goal, through multiple types of ministries, is to combat this epidemic by providing help, hope, and uniting in the love of our Lord Jesus. Through sponsors, typically American Christians like us, this ministry has been able to expand their outreach to the desolated, rural communities outside of the city. These communities all throughout the country are ravaged by rival gangs that often control supplies, money, and the humans themselves. Recruiting begins at young ages, meaning that breaking the cycle of violence with the children is crucial to changing the trajectory of these individuals' lives.

The last time I served, I was able to help my friends, the local missionaries, teach free English classes in two locations. These classes helped to keep the kids off the streets and out of the gangs, as well as allow all students more options for employment in the future. Speaking fluent English offers well-paying jobs in El Salvador, as well as more options if they choose to leave the country and move abroad. I will be helping with these community classes, including at a new location to where they've expanded since I left. I hope to also have the chance to aid in the small entrepreneurships in the rural communities. Starting viable businesses in areas with little resources helps to improve the quality of life and breathe new hope into these villages.

As I move forward and prepare for this trip, I would appreciate your help. Please keep me in your prayers and if you feel the Lord calling you to support me financially, I will be doing several fundraisers throughout this summer to help offset the \$3,500 I need for my housing, food, transportation, and airfare. Thank you all for your support and love!








Oh, by the way. My grandkids were playing hide and seek at my house. One got lost in the spare room with all the material. CAN YOU FIND HIM?






### IT'S ALMOST PEACH FESTIVAL TIME


