# A Message from Pastor Kristin

Pastor Kristin's Ash Wednesday Sermon 2.26.2020

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

I've been in many conversations with people lately that have talked about the "doom and gloom" of our world. About the pain and suffering of so many people, about concerns over the flu and the coronavirus, about divisions in our nation and divisions among people, about concerns for our safety and the environment. It seems that as chicken little said "the sky is falling" and maybe it is.

But while there are so many overwhelming challenges around us, some of us go on living like it doesn't and won't affect us, while some of us are feeling so overwhelmed we can't make a difference.

All of this reminds me of "The Starfish Story."

A young man is walking along the ocean and sees a beach on which thousands and thousands of starfish have washed ashore. Further along he sees an old man, walking slowly and stooping often, picking up one starfish after another and tossing each one gently into the ocean. "Why are you throwing starfish into the ocean?," he asks. "Because the sun is up and the tide is going out and if I don't throw them further in they will die." "But, old man, don't you realize there are miles and miles of beach and starfish all along it! You can't possibly save them all, you can't even save one-tenth of them. In fact, even if you work all day, your efforts won't make any difference at all." The old man listened calmly and then bent

Down to pick up another starfish and threw it into the sea. "It made a difference to that one."

It made a difference to that one.

Today is Ash Wednesday – it is a day when we remember our mortality. We hear the words "remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." A day some people may choose to avoid because many of us don't like to think about death at all, we try to avoid it.

Today we remember that God created us up out of the dust, that God gave life to us and one day whether we want to think about it or not we will return to the dust. It happens to all of us – none of us is immune from death.

Someone recently said to me, "death is the great enemy." Death is an enemy, yes, but for those of us who have faith and believe we are reminded that sin and death are not the last words for us and in the midst of all that overwhelms us we have hope and the promise of everlasting life.

Today is a very solemn day in the church year, second to Good Friday. This is not a shiny happy people day but a day we remember we've come from the dust and to the dust we will return.

In this season of lent we are called once again to love and serve God and our neighbors. We are **invited to "self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love."** What is it that you will do or not do these next 40 days to grow in your relationship in love and service to God and your neighbors?

Will you take time to pray? Maybe it's as simple as praying "The Lord's Prayer" each day. Will you take time to read the bible? Maybe start a plan with the Bible App or take the bulletin home each week and read through the readings throughout the week. Will you decide to increase your giving to our congregation? Supporting the ministry which happens here and far beyond our walls. Will you take time to be still and know that God is with you each day? Take time to enjoy God's creation, listening to where God is calling you? Is it giving up something? Take these 40 days to focus on loving God and our neighbors more – just one thing each day can make a difference.

The sky might be falling, but we are called to be like the man walking along the beach tossing starfish back into the sea. We are called to do our part to make a difference, no matter how big or how small because for that one, it makes all of the difference.

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." And remember that the one who gave life to you out of the dust is with you in these 40 days and every day.

**February 26 (Ash Wednesday): Community of St. Dysmas** – prison ministry of Delaware-Maryland Synod.

**March 4 (Wednesday Lenten Service): Access Carroll** – provides medical treatment and prescriptions to those people who do not have healthcare coverage.

**March 11 (Wednesday Lenten Service): Sober Truth Substance Abuse Treatment Program** – hope to be a model for other treatment programs. We want to provide temporary transitional housing, employment guidance and nutritional counseling in the future.

March 18 (Wednesday Lenten Service): Carroll County Food Sunday – food distribution center for those in need.


March 25 (Wednesday Lenten Service): Mosaic, Inc. – helps those who are suffering from mental illness

**April 1 (Wednesday Lenten Service): Fisher House** – a network of comfort homes where military and veterans' families can stay at no cost while a loved one is receiving treatment. These homes are located at major military and VA medical centers nationwide.

**April 9 (Maundy Thursday): Carroll Hospice** – Non-profit organization dedicated to improving the quality of life for patients needing end-of-life care, allowing them to live as fully and comfortably as possible by providing quality palliative care, pain and symptom management and support for their families.

**April 10 (Good Friday): Pregnancy Support Center** – seeks to create a safe non-judgmental environment where individuals can come to discuss their pregnancy related concerns in hope of a positive choice.

April 12 (Easter): ELCA Lutheran Disaster Response and Lutheran Immigration & Refugee Service. Lutheran Disaster Response – has a rich history of responding to disasters. This work encompasses the disaster response work of the ELCA in both the USA and internationally. In both areas, there has been a long commitment to working with local communities in a way that allows them to develop their own response. Lutheran Immigration & Refugee Service - working diligently with government and service partners to care for Central American children and families fleeing to the US for refuge. LIRS is playing a national advocacy role as well as a service role during the current emergency. LIRS provides services to unaccompanied migrant children that uphold their best interests and recognize their vulnerabilities to exploitation and abuse.
