The Season of Lent

March 6 (Ash Wednesday): Community of St. Dysmas – prison ministry of Delaware-Maryland Synod.

March 13 (Wednesday Lenten Service): Access Carroll – provides health assistance for those in need, an outreach program of Carroll Hospital Center.

March 20 (Wednesday Lenten Service): Carroll County Habitat for Humanity non-profit group of volunteers who build new homes or repair existing homes for the less fortunate.

March 27 (Wednesday Lenten Service): Haitian Timoun Foundation– We are a very high impact, clearly focused, grassroots movement that has been bringing hope, sustainability, and dignity to the children and people of Haiti for more than 10 years. We believe in education, economic development, community engagement, and local leadership.

April 3 (Wednesday Lenten Service): Mosaic, Inc. – Helps those who are suffering from mental illness.

April 10 (Wednesday Lenten Service): Fisher House – A network of comfort homes where military and veterans' families can stay at no cost while a loved one is receiving treatment. These homes are located at major military and VA medical centers nationwide.

April 18 (Maundy Thursday): Carroll Hospice – Helps families who have members who are terminally ill, providing medical care and spiritual care, another outreach program of Carroll Hospital Center.

April 19 (Good Friday): Tender Care Pregnancy Center – A faith-based, non-profit organization dedicated to helping women with pregnancy related concerns. Provides pregnancy testing and verifications, limited to first and second trimester ultrasounds, counseling, community referrals, parenting classes, and material assistance to anyone in need.

April 21 (Easter): Lutheran Disaster Response & Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service. Lutheran Disaster Response brings God's hoe, healing and renewal to people whose lives have been disrupted by disasters in the United States and around the world. When the dust settles and the headlines change, they stay to provide ongoing assistance to those in need. Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service – Works diligently with government and service partners to care for Central American children and families fleeing to the US for refuge. LIRS is playing a national advocacy role as well as a service role during this current emergency. LIRS provides service to unaccompanied migrant children, which upholds their best interests and recognizes their vulnerabilities to exploitation and abuse.

Charitable Giving and New Tax Laws after Retirement

With the new tax laws many people will find that they will no longer be itemizing their deductions and therefore will not be getting a tax benefit for their charitable giving. For individuals age 70 and $\frac{1}{2}$ and older there is a way that you can still get a tax benefit. This will work for donations to the church or any qualified 501c(3) organization.

If you are taking an RMD (required minimum distributions) from an IRA, you can elect to have some of this sent directly to charities. This will count as part of your RMD but you will not be taxed on the amount sent directly to the charities. Therefore, you will be reducing your taxable income by these donations.

As an example: If your RMD is \$10,000 and you elect to have \$5,000 sent directly to charities. You taxable RMD will be \$5,000.

If you have questions or would like to hear more about this there will be a short coffee hour after church on March 10th where Janet Gross will answer questions. Of course, you should check with your tax advisor to see if this might work for your situation.




We know God has given us all special individual talents and strengths. No one is unimportant to Him and He wants us to work together share His love and to always trust in Him.


MORE FROM THE YOUTH
