



Rip, Strip, and Roll

Now that I have your attention!! The women's group would like to start rolling bandages for Global Health Ministries. Even the most basic supplies are often lacking at mission hospitals and clinics overseas. Many health facilities have limited access to clean, affordable bandages, an item they use every day as they care for patients. They use simple rolled bandages that can be made from used WHITE cotton or cotton-blend sheets.

So....The women's group will be looking for WHITE cotton sheets. We will then Rip them into 3 inch strips, STRIP them of any stray threads and then ROLL them for use as bandages. If you have any WHITE sheets or have contacts with hotels/motels that might give us their old sheets, we would appreciate it very much. Once we have some sheets, we will RIP,STRIP and ROLL them for Global Health Ministries. We will let you know when we do this RIP, STRIP, and ROLL and you can come help if you like. Any questions??
