Every three years, 30,000 high school youth and their adult leaders from across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gather for a week of faith formation known as the Gathering. Through days spent in interactive learning, worship, Bible study, service and fellowship, young people grow in faith and are challenged and inspired to live their faith in their daily lives. Cost: Total cost per person is about \$1000 (which includes registration, hotel, transportation, and food), BUT our goal is that **each participant contribute \$300** and we will work to fundraise the rest.

There will be a festival choir as we celebrate our mutual work within the Kingdom of God. Our offering will support the work of Carroll Lutheran School.





Luthergarten Tree



As a means of giving expression to the commemoration of the Lutheran Reformation, the *Luthergarten* (Luthergarden) has been established in Wittenberg, Germany on the grounds of the former town fortifications. In connection with this project, 500 trees will be planted at different places in the city region, giving a concrete sign of the optimism so clearly expressed in Luther's apple tree quotation: "Even if I knew that the world was to collapse tomorrow, I would still plant my apple tree today." In May of 2016, a maple-leafed sycamore tree was planted in the garden on behalf of the Delaware-Maryland Synod (Tree #287).

Through this cooperative project, the *Luthergarten* will stimulate interaction and set a communication process in motion. Positive impulses will emerge and spread out into the town, the region, the country and, finally, into the world. In this way, the far-reaching significance of the Reformation will become tangible.

The project has been initiated by the Lutheran World Federation in Geneva, with support from the German National Committee of the LWF and the United Evangelical Lutheran Church of Germany (VELKD) and by cooperation with Lutherstadt Wittenberg.

Our synod's <u>Creation Care Ministry</u> has been awarded a grant from the Chesapeake Bay Trust to plant 500 trees to commemorate the anniversary of the Reformation.
